Charges for campus parking for the entire school man will be made a






- 1. A written approval must be obtained from the director of housing and presented to the Comptroller for the specified payment.
- 2. The student must have been absent for approved cause in excess of ten consecutive days. The amount of the refund will be on a pro-rata basis beginning with the eleventh day of absence.
- 3. A student who withdraws from college before the close of a semester will be refunded board charges on a pro-rata basis for all remaining days paid for in advance.


Room rent charges may be refunded as follows:

HOUSING 26 Apartments A limited number of accommodations for married couples are located








### History

The Graduate School was instituted in the fall, 1960, with the offering of the Master of Arts degree in the fields of history and English. Teacher certification programs were also available in each of these fields.

In 1962, master's degrees were authorized in mathematics, engineering, and elementary education. Additional master's degrees in chemistry and in special education have been authorized beginning in the fall of 1965.

<u>Ohiectives</u>

- 1. An applicant must hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent from an institution approved by a recognized accrediting agency.
- 2. The following official credentials should be filed with the Dean of the Graduate School at least four weeks before registration.
  - A. An official transcript sent directly from each college previously attended.
  - B. Two completed copies of the application for admission to the Graduate School.
  - C. Scores on the aptitude and the appropriate subject matter area of the Graduate Record Examination (sent directly to the Dean of the Graduate School by the Educational Testing
